..... There are limits to how many sports can be included in the Olympic Games. In the 2012 Summer Games, there were 26, and the International Olympic Committee (IOC) have added two more for 2016 (golf and rugby sevens). There are various criteria that the IOC bases its decisions on, but the most important is probably international popularity. Sports tend to get included if they have a tradition and are played and watched by enough people in enough countries.

..... This leads to some interesting questions. Why, for example, was baseball included from 1984, but then dropped for 2012? Although some think it is only popular in the USA, it actually has a large following in South America and Asia too. The main reason for leaving it out, according to some, is a combination of geography and politics: There is little interest in the sport in Europe, and European members are in a majority on the IOC.

..... Of the other sports not (yet) included, one that stands out is squash. It has a long tradition and is played all over the world. It's also more obviously a real sport than some other Olympic sports. In fact, it is more mysterious why certain sports are included. Take speed walking, for example the rules say the athletes have to have both feet in contact with the ground at all times, and must keep their legs straight. The result, to me at least, looks very silly.

..... More importantly, it breaks one of my two personal rules for judging serious sports because it puts artificial limits on what can be done. My other rule is that the scoring has to be objective and measurable, not a matter of opinion. And of course, both of these criteria would rule out everyone's favourite example of an Olympic non-sport: synchronized swimming

Who needs friends? According to most psychologists we all do. It seems that having friends keeps us both healthy and happy. Friendship is a relationship with wide, ambiguous, and even shifting boundaries. To think and communicate effectively about the topic, people find it necessary to use features such as true friends, best friends, close friends, and friendly acquaintances. Psychologist Dorothy Rowe says that many of us now turn to our friends, instead of our families, for advice, comfort and security. One woman she interviewed told her that if she had to choose between her husband and her friend, she would choose her friend. But is friendship equally important to women and men? According to author Rhonda Pritchard, women are more likely than men to have close friends. For men, friendship is usually based on doing things together, not the intimate conversations that are typical of women friends. Men share activities like building a fence or a business, running, riding a bike or watching football, but they don't often share their feelings. Although many women find their relationships with a husband is not enough, many men say that their partner is their best friend. There is, in fact, more and more evidence that having friends protects us against illness and depression. The uninhibited laughter that is typical of many friendships reduces the effects of stress and helps the immune system work properly. Lasting friendships can provide a lot of the same support that families do.
