Reading Comprehension. (40 points) Question Number One: (20 points)

However, many studies by social scientists have shown that becoming friends with another person is a complex process, but one that can be learnt. Making (and keeping) friends isn't easy – it takes effort. Here are the top five tips for turning someone you know into a lasting friend.

Everyone has acquaintances – people we know, but who aren't (yet) friends. To take your relationship further than just discussing the weather, you need to show an interest in their lives. Ask them questions (but don't get too personal at first). **Even more importantly**, listen to their answers and remember the information for the next time you meet.

Maybe you made a joke that annoyed your new friend, or forgot to call when you promised to <u>.</u> It's almost inevitable that something will go wrong at some point, but it's how you react to the situation that may be more important than the initial error. An honest apology and making the effort not to let it happen again are usually all that's needed.

When making arrangements, there are two opposite ways of behaving that can harm a friendship. The first is forcing the other person to make all the decisions by saying things like 'I don't mind, you choose' or 'Whatever you want'. **The other** is being too particular and inflexible about what you want to happen, or where, or when. Try to find a middle way between the two extremes.

It's understandable that you want to impress a new friend and make them aware of your good points, but don't go too far. Research shows that most of us tend to like people who don't boast about their achievements or take themselves too seriously.

If someone tells you something 'in confidence', it means just that – they are confident that you won't tell anyone else. In other words, they trust you. If you then pass on this information to another person, that trust is broken. Even if your friend doesn't find out what you've done, <u>this kind of behaviour</u> can easily destroy a friendship over time.

Are you thinking about starting an online store? If so, you're not alone. Online business is a rapidly growing industry, more and more businesses are making the move to sell their products and services online.

Online business comes in a variety of forms, each with special advantages. The most popular one is business-to-consumer e-commerce platforms such as Amazon and eBay. In this form, businesses sell products or services directly to consumers using these sites. Whereas in business-to-business e-commerce platforms like Alibaba and Etsy, businesses offer goods or services only to other businesses. Another important form is consumer-to-consumer e-commerce platforms like Craigslist and eBay where consumers sell goods or services to other customers.

Nowadays, more and more consumers prefer doing shopping online to using stores in the neighborhoods. Consumers can make purchases from their homes at any time of day or night. E-commerce often offers customers lower prices than traditional stores because businesses save costs like rent, utilities, and employees. Online shoppers typically have access to a broader variety of products and services than <u>they</u> would in local establishments.

Online commerce also offers businesses a more efficient way to manage inventory orders and costs. <u>It</u> enables businesses reach a wider audience. If you have an online store, people from all over the world can purchase your products.

There are also some significant drawbacks that businesses and consumers should be aware of. One of the biggest disadvantages of e-commerce is the risk of being a victim of misleading and deception because commercial deals are completed online. Another downside to e-commerce is the potential for cyberattack or **'hacking''**. Hackers can target online stores and steal sensitive customers' data, such as credit card numbers and addresses. By allowing customers to buy goods and services online, e-commerce becomes a strong competitor to physical stores and put them at a disadvantage.
